



Warm Handover Incentive (2024–2026)

For Community Food Projects in Suffolk

This scheme aims to encourage and enable food projects to use the Warm Handover scheme to refer clients to wrap-around services that can provide further support. Food projects will be given £30 per individual referred (as long as it includes a referral to one of the eligible support services); the money can be used to procure food, buy storage solutions, cover training costs, invest in technology, etc. The organisation referred to will also receive £30.

STEP 1

Join SIP and Warm Handover

To join the SIP and Warm Handover Referral Scheme, you will be required to complete the Community Action Suffolk Organisation HealthCheck: CAS Organisation HealthCheck

You will need to provide your:

- 1. Data Protection Policy
- 2. Safeguarding Policy
- 3 Information Sharing Agreement (s
- 4. Organisation logo (basic image will suffice)
- 5. Short paragraph about what you do
- 6. Contact details

Submit all of the above to:

Once all documents are received and agreed by SIP Admin, your organisation will be added to the SIP mailing list & website, and set up on the WHRS.

STEP 2

Make referrals using the Warm Handover Scheme

Referrals which include VCFSE organisations providing Employment, Housing, Debt, and Benefits advice will be eligible for the £30 incentive payment.

Referrals MUST be made through the Warm Handover scheme.

Payment is per individual, not per service referred.

STEP 3

Receive payments for all eligible referrals after each referral window

First window: 1 August 2024 – 30 September 2024.

Subsequent windows: Three-month intervals until 30 September 2026.

Scheme may close early if referrals exceed budget predictions.
